Our provision

- 12 classrooms in school –maximum number of classes is 12.
- Nursery: Provision for up to 26 children per session depending on applications. Class organisation and staffing is set based on the number of applications.
- Reception: Yearly intake of up to 45 children with classroom organisation adapted to match the intake.

12:15-3:15 Afternoon session

8:45-3:15 Full day session

(Anyone dropping off or picking up children must be aged over 18 years)

Learning through play which is done both indoors and outdoors.



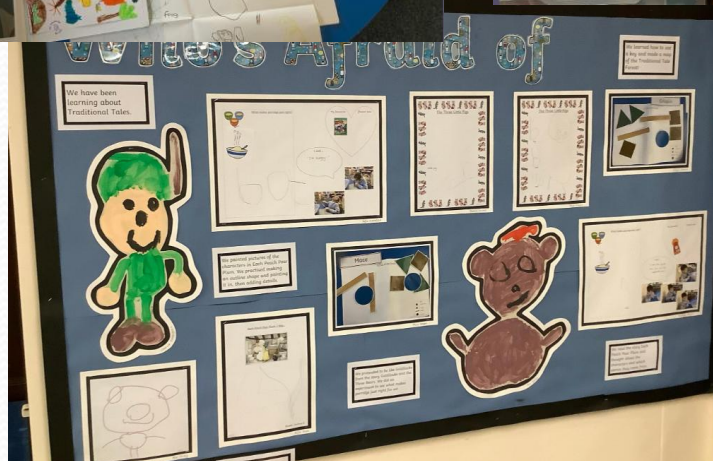
Outdoor area is shared by all Foundation Stage children

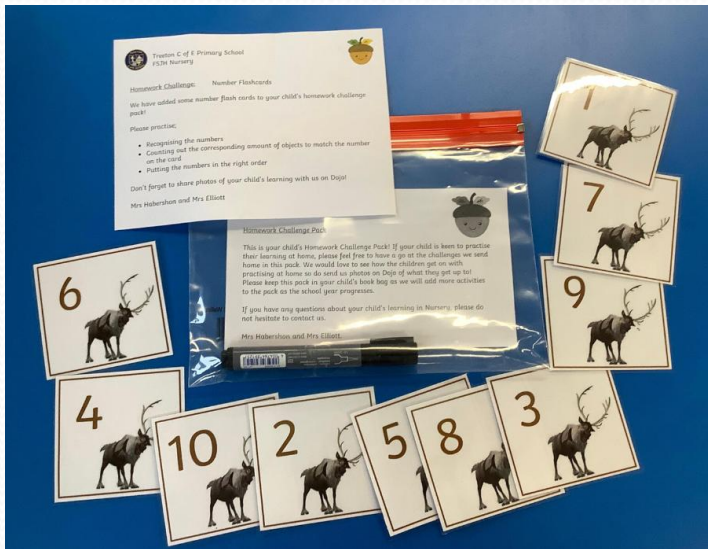
Parents and School in partnership

- Opportunities to share key events with your child.



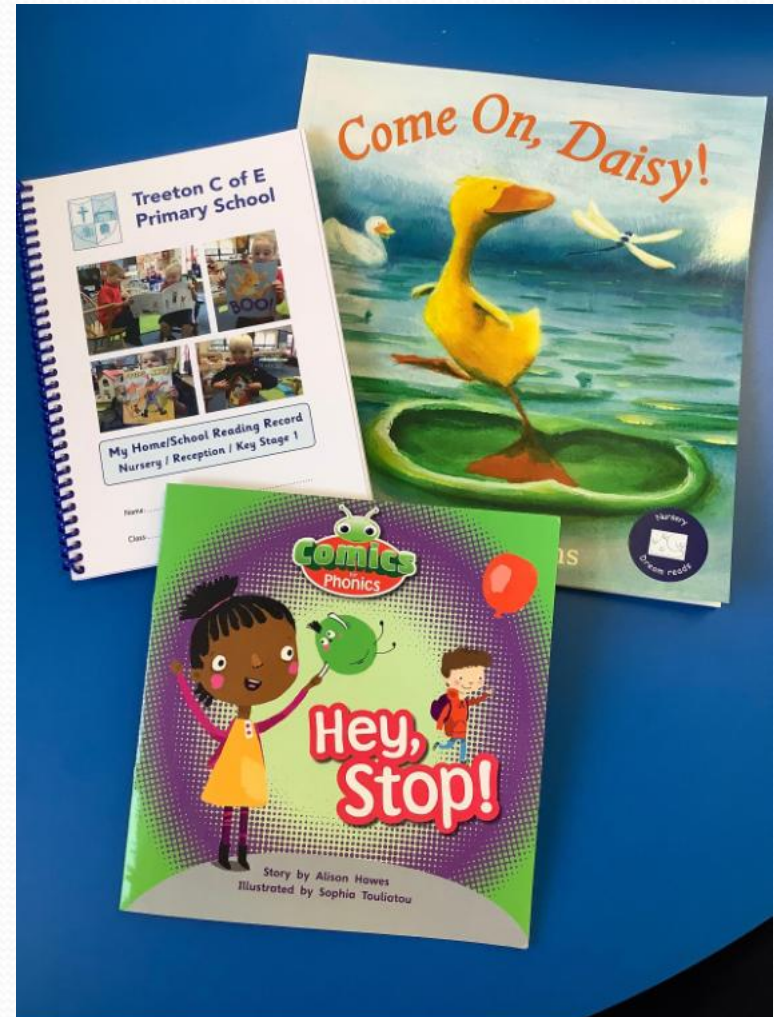
Parents and School in partnership

- Home learning book/pack to include topic based challenges and information sharing between school and home.

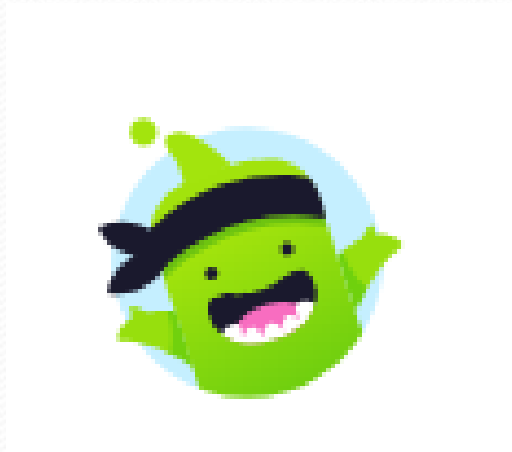


Parents and School in partnership

- Encourage good attendance:
95% attendance
- Encourage independence and support your child's organisation -make sure children have the relevant things
- Encourage reading at home – regular reading of reading book 3x a week (fill in child's reading diary)



- Class Do-jo used regularly to share learning between school and home.

Clothing

- All children to wear school uniform – details in the information pack
- Make sure clothes are easy for children to get on and off
- Please label all clothing (including footwear)
- Children have access to outdoors every day – need appropriate clothing
- Stud earrings only (other jewellery is not part of our dress code).
- Wellington boots and gardening gloves are recommended for Forest School activities.

What your child will need

- School uniform – This can be ordered from Pinders, or bought from any supermarket without school badge.
(See pack for details)
- Book bag - these can be purchased from Pinders
- Wellingtons and gardening gloves for Forest school activities.

Independence

- Children are encouraged to do things for themselves e.g getting dressed, changing shoes, putting on coats and fastening them up, tidying toys away, recognising their name etc
- Parents can help with this at home before children start school – encourage them to have a go and praise their achievements!
- Toilets – Children can go to the toilet whenever they like. If your child has any difficulties using the toilet independently please discuss this with a member of staff tonight. There is still time to practise over the summer!

Lunch and snack

- If your child is staying for lunch they can be either:

- Packed lunches – bring their own lunch from home

or

- Hot lunches – Ordered through Lunch Hound (information in your packs).

- Milk or water and fruit provided for snack daily.

Transition:

- Children are invited to attend two transition sessions:
 - Week commencing 7th July – Children will be invited to a 30 minute session to play alongside current nursery children. An adult will need to stay with them.
 - Wednesday 16th July pm visit – 45 minute visit in the classroom with the new nursery cohort. An adult will need to stay with them.
 - Opportunity to sign up for a home visit from the class teacher. Please sign up today.
 - Opportunity to attend a 1-1 visit with the class teacher in school. These will be discussed when you attend the transition session on week commencing 8th July.

Start dates

- School will be using a staggered start system in September. (Letters are in your packs)
- Monday 1st and Tuesday 2nd September are INSET days.
- Wednesday 3rd September beginning of school year.
- 6 new children each day.
- All children will be in school by Monday 9th September.

Information for parents

- School website – lots of information and pictures.
- Regular news letters from class teachers and School to inform of events etc.
- Dojo – sign up and receive curriculum updates, messages and pictures.

Additional information

- We don't currently offer wraparound care for Nursery children, however this is something we are looking at being able to offer in the future. Our wraparound provision starts from Reception age.
- Railway Children offer walking bus for morning and pick ups to provide wrap around care.
